
Vocabulary instruction is imperative for readers to comprehend text. As a reader's vocabulary grows, their comprehension also increases.


Graphic Organizer Instructions:

FREE WRITING is a technique that allows writers to openly write about various topics with minimal limitations for a given amount of time. While writing, the focus should be on pouring as many ideas as possible into your writing, rather than structure, editing, or revising. Free writing is beneficial for many reasons, such as building confidence, allowing inspiration and honesty, and expanding emotional connections to the created piece.
