Rescue Us provide's a holistic, faith-based, transitional housing **program** for female survivors. Our program involves 1) provision of safe and stable housing to our residents and 2) implementation of Rescue Us developmental activities, such as mental health counseling, Bible study, vocational training, and much more. We also aim to provide **long-term care** for the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of our survivors.

NSI owns and operates The Harbor, a restoration home and program for female sex-trafficking survivors. The Harbor's 6-to-18 month program addresses the "whole" woman from a traumaspecific perspective, and all staff members are trauma-informed. The program is strengthsbased, tailored to survivors' individual needs, and matched to their current stage of change.



We have beautiful homes where women can rest, *reset and consider next steps with compassionate* supportive people around them. This year-long phase engages women in healing body, mind, and spirit in a safe community and place to belong. This time allows survivors to heal from trauma and move from a survival-based existence to an intentional lifestyle that focuses on physical and mental health and well being. Watch more here!



The Pure Hope Foundation offers a restorative developmental internship for female adult survivors of sex trafficking. The twelve-month residential internship is crafted in phases encompassing inner healing, personal development, life skills, and leadership mentoring. A highlight of the internship is an eight-week, strengths based, capstone experience offering adventure and expanded relational learning. Read more *here*!
