KEY TAKEAWAYS

- Your sexual narrative provides the foundation from which you reason about every sexual issue. Most people are unaware of their sexual narrative even though it informs their beliefs and behaviors.
- The cultural narrative of sex flows from humanism and relativism. Sex is important because it represents a primary piece of identity. Sexual maturity means authentically living out of your sexual desires and longings. Sexual morality is rooted in giving people the freedom to pursue sexual passions as long as they don't harm other people.
- The cultural narrative of sex is the predominant narrative of our day. It has impacted practically every Christian's thinking about sexual issues. However, it is based on assumptions that oppose biblical truth.
- The purity narrative of sex is the traditional way many Christian have presented God and sex. The focus is almost exclusively on "saving sex for marriage." Although it presents some truths about sexual purity, the simplistic focus leaves many people missing more important biblical truths about holiness, redemption, and God's heart for humanity.
